- Once the request is processed, a co-tenant change notification will be issued to all tenants and the lessor confirming the updated bond details and the outgoing tenants have been removed and incoming tenants have been recorded against the bond.
- This office does not process a refund to outgoing tenants upon submission of this form. Outgoing tenants should not sign this form unless the incoming/remaining tenants have paid them their portion of the bond.
- Please note bond money will be divided equally between the tenants noted on this form where an approved refund request has been processed.
